# Description

In contrast to European philosophical movements – for which technology became one of the most central topics during the last century – US-American analytic philosophy rarely discussed technology as a philosophical issue. During the last three decades though, especially influenced by anthropology and phenomenology, philosophy of technology became more central within the mainstream philosophical discourse in the US. We will read and discuss major proponents of this discourse.
